### Cinderella



The whole school will be going to The Brindley theatre in Runcorn on the 6th January to see the pantomime Cinderella. School will be covering the majority of the cost of both the ticket price and transport although we will be requesting a £5 donation per child. We have been fortunate to secure tickets to take the whole school to "Van Gogh Alive the experience" at Media City on Tuesday 11th January 2022.

We will use this experience as inspiration for a whole school artist study and art project. Further details will be sent out nearer the time.

### Swimming



Due to Covid 19 the school has not been able to provide regular swimming lessons for children in KS2 for almost 2 years. We are also aware that all children have had limited access to casual swimming and swimming lessons outside of the school curriculum.

Our solution is to bring a temporary pool and swimming teachers to Hale CE for 3 weeks early in the Spring term.

The pool will be outdoors but is heated, covered by a large marquee and will have heated changing rooms. We will ensure that all children in Years 2 -6 have regular slots with the swimming teachers over the 3 weeks. Children in Reception and Year 1 will have the opportunity to have some lessons at the end of the school day and we will ask for some parental help with changing etc. This will be fully funded by school.

### Supporting learning at home



All children are expected to read every school night. For those children in KS2 this can be a mixture of their reading/library books and Reading Plus.

Please ensure you record when your child has read.
On a Friday we will invite children who have not read at home during the week to a break time reading session where they will have the opportunity to read.

The children in KS2 should be able to access Reading Plus independently at home - they all do this regularly in school.

Daily practice of at least 5 minutes will help your child to have greater success in Maths.

Children should be able to access this independently once they have become familiar with it.





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Please visit our website to see our recent updated information about how we teach phonics here at Hale CE. The information is in the curriculum area.

After half term individual phonics packs will be created and sent home for parents of Reception and KS1 children to help you support and reinforce what has been taught in school.
