As usual we have had a busy start to the half term. On Tuesday we had a "Shine" day led by local Poet and Author Paul Delaney. As the children are representing the school can I ask that they wear their school uniform and have on a warm coat. We are always complimented on how smart our children look and how well behaved they are.

I look forward to seeing as many children as possible on Sunday to take part in this important event.

## Home Learning



Key Stage One (Year One and Two)

- Daily reading from scheme books that are sent home or allocated online
- Numbots to be completed for 10 minutes per day
- Spelling Practice (linked to phonics learning)

Key Stage Two (Years 3-6)

- 15 mins Reading Plus completed daily (Monday-Friday)
- Spelling Shed (5 mins per day Monday-Friday)
- Times Tables Rock Stars (5 mins per day Monday-Friday).
- Reading books to be read over the weekend and logs to be filled in.

Online homework will be checked every Friday by teachers. If pupils have not completed the expected amount, they will catch up during their recreational time.

On occasion, additional homework might be set, depending on the class' needs. This will be down to the discretion of the class teacher.
