Home Learning




Key Stage One (Year One and Two)

- Daily reading from scheme books that are sent home or allocated online (Year 2 may also access Reading Plus)
- Numbots to be completed for 10 minutes per day
- Spelling Practice (linked to phonics learning) or Spelling Shed for Year 2.

Key Stage Two (Years 3-6)

- 15 mins Reading Plus completed daily (Monday-Friday)
- Spelling Shed (5 mins per day Monday-Friday)
- Times Tables Rock Stars (5 mins per day Monday-Friday).
- Reading books to be read over the weekend and logs to be filled in.





On occasion, additional homework might be set, depending on the class' needs. This will be down to the discretion of the class teacher.
