A prayer in the dining room


Take a moment to pray for those families who are isolated in their homes together.

What a busy first week back we've had in Reception! We've been working on the numbers 6, 7 and 8 in Maths and we read the story of The Three Little Pigs and the Big Bad Wolf in Literacy. We saw some great examples of how the characters might be feeling and what they might be thinking. We also had our Zoom form time, which we love, and our first live Phonics lesson! We're looking forward to seeing more of your fantastic work next week Reception.

Year 1 have made a great start to the half term creating predictions about our new story book and completing their work on time. We really enjoyed seeing the children on the live zoom lessons and their answers and work were very impressive

Year 2 have been excited to start their India topic this week and have been experimenting with Indian Gond Art. Preparations are well underway to welcome back our classmates and we have been expressing our hopes and wishes for the 8th of March when we will all be together again.

After a well-earned half-term break, the children in Year 3 have been busy learning about statistics in Maths and have been working hard to improve their grammar in English lessons. It has been lovely to meet for our Zoom form time but particularly nice to get back to interacting with the children during our Live Lesson on Zoom this morning. Now, I can't wait to get back to teaching you all in class again in just over a week.

Well done to Year 4 for quickly settling back into home learning this week. This week, the children have had a lovely time making predictions about their new class story and have worked very hard in all lessons. The children should be very proud of themselves. Keep up the hard work Year 4!

Well done to Year 5 for their continuing with hard work this week after half term. In maths, we have been completing work on different types of angles and how to calculate angles on a straight line and around a point. We finished reading our class book 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' and spent our Zoom time planning our own myths linked to this. Keep up the good work!

A fabulous return to our Spring term Year 6. You have produced amazing acrostic poems about the Galapagos Islands and informative fact files about the species that inhabit them, I've really enjoyed reading them. Well done for all of your hard work.

School Improvements Works

Over the half term break new carpet was fitted in most of the classrooms they now look very smart for the children's return.

New tables and chairs are also on the way which will complete the classroom upgrades for now.
