Summer Events Update

On Friday 18th June we received new guidance from Halton's Director of Public Health regarding normal school summer events for example sports days. After receiving this guidance, we have had to make significant changes to our plans, we had planned to hold a series of class bubble events that parents in groups of up to 30 could attend, however this is no longer possible.

School trips have had to be cancelled or postponed for all year groups and events will now happen without any spectators or an audience. We do however intend to take pictures and where possible short videos that we will upload to SeeSaw or Tapestry. Please ensure that we have permission to share your child's image with the class group on SeeSaw or Tapestry. There will always be a small number of children that it is not possible to widely share their image but we will work around this.

In the Autumn term when hopefully restrictions have fully lifted we intend to make up for the missed opportunities for parental involvement in school life!

Polite Reminder - Please check the school's uniform guidelines before purchasing your child's uniform including PE kits for next school year. Trainers are not acceptable school shoes. During the course of next year we will be looking at making just a few changes to some aspects of the uniform although this will not effect the policy until September 2022.






Sports Day

If the weather is looking good they will also need a sun hat and sun cream applied before they come in.


We will aim to share any pictures and videos by the end of the following day.
