Early Opening



As we return from half term we will be opening up school to children earlier at 8.40am.

This change will take place from the 2nd day back (2nd November)

We are opening early to allow more time for Maths activities in Years 2 -6 and Phonics activities in Reception and Year 1.

During this time their will be no new teaching it will be extra time for teachers to support the children applying what has previously been taught.

In order to allow staff to focus on supporting the children completing their early morning tasks we are making a few changes to the way the children come into school for some classes.

Children in Reception and Year 1 will continue to come in through their classroom doors although these will now open from 8.40am.

Children in Years 2 - 6 will enter school through double doors on the playground by the Year 6 classroom.

We will explain this to the children on the first day back.

There will always be 2 members of staff to greet the children at this double door and see them safely inside.

There will be no changes to the end of day routine as we think it is important to maintain some daily contact with the class teacher.

Christian Values Friendship


Our class Worship Ambassadors have been growing in confidence over the past few weeks. Their parents have been into classes this week to watch them support and lead Collective Worship.

Supporting learning at home



All children are expected to read every school night. For those children in KS2 this can be a mixture of their reading/library books and Reading Plus.

Please ensure you record when your child has read.

On a Friday we will invite children who have not read at home during the week to a break time reading session where they will have the opportunity to read.

The children in KS2 should be able to access Reading Plus independently at home - they all do this regularly in school.

Daily practice of at least 5 minutes will help your child to have greater success in Maths.

Children should be able to access this independently once they have become familiar with it.
